SUBJECT: Reporting of donations received by the Library for the quarter of January 1, 2014 through March 31, 2014

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Library Services and Community Outreach requests the Board accept, and instruct the Clerk of the Board to file, the quarterly report of donations in the amount of \$2,000 or less gifted to the Library from January 1, 2014 through March 31, 2014.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Director of Library Services and Community Outreach is reporting the Library received \$1,612.26 during the quarter ending March 31, 2014. The donations were accepted by the Director in accordance with Resolution 99-56 and deposited within the Library Fund.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On June 1, 1999, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 99-56 authorizing the Director of Library Services and Community Outreach to accept on behalf of the Napa County Library donations of money and gifts of \$2,000 or less to support existing Library services and programs. Today, the Director of Library Services is reporting donations received during the three months ending March 31, 2014. The Library received \$1,612.26, consisting of several donations received throughout the quarter and deposited into the Library operational budget. Three donations totalling \$332 were designated for Literacy services.

The donations received by the Library are deposited into the Library operational budget. All donations are used to support ongoing services and programs such as: free wireless internet access, free public internet computers, and purchases for additions to the Library's collection. Depending on the amount of donations received within a given fiscal year, the Library may increase the level of a particular ongoing Library service or program. Ongoing Library services and programs are not dependent on these donations for overall operations. Unless requested by the donor, the Library does not designate these donations to any specific library location but rather allocates these funds to support ongoing programs and services as needed throughout the fiscal year.
