RECOMMENDATION

RFP AGREEMENT

REQUESTED ACTION: Approval and authorization for the Chair to sign Agreement No. 2011-13 with Tom Vence dba Vence Consulting, for the term November 3, 2010 through December 31, 2012 in an amount not to exceed \$32,000, for preparation of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for waste disposal services.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At the October 6, 2011 meeting, the Board of Directors directed staff to issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for disposal of MSW and ADC from the Devlin Road Transfer Station. The objective of the RFP process is to select a site or sites to provide long-term disposal of the Authority's waste after expiration of the current contract with Keller Canyon Landfill on June 30, 2012.

Due to limited staff resources, it will be necessary for the Authority to engage the services of an outside consultant to assist in the development and review of the RFP. Vence Consulting has previously provided services to the Authority, most recently during the review of modifications to the contract with Northern Recycling and Operations in 2010, and is well qualified to assist with the RFP process.

Approval of the agreement will expedite the RFP process.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The contract limit of \$32,000 should be sufficient to cover preparation and review of proposals, provided there are no protests or appeals of the RFP process or the final selection.
